









Early Childhood IDEA Centers On Call

The U.S. Department of Education's Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) has funded five national TA Centers to respond to requests for technical assistance from state Part C & Part B 619 agencies: the Center for IDEA Early Childhood Data Systems (DaSy), the Early Childhood Personnel Center (ECPC), the Early Childhood Technical Assistance Center (ECTA), the IDEA Data Center (IDC), and the National Center for Systemic Improvement (NCSI).

The TA Centers focus on distinct but also overlapping areas and are working together to make sure that each state receives the best technical assistance we can provide. This document is meant to help states better understand the content focus of the five TA Centers.

Which TA Center should I contact if my state needs help with an early childhood (EC) IDEA issue?

Check with your contact at any of the five TA Centers. Your contact will make sure your request gets to the right Center. Here are some examples of each Center's areas of expertise.
