

SiMR Statement and Changes

- Has your SiMR changed?
- Provide a description of the system analysis activities conducted to support changing the SiMR.
- List the data source(s) used to support the change of the SiMR.
- Provide a description of how the State analyzed data to reach the decision to change the SiMR.
- Describe the role of stakeholders in decision-making.

Use of a subset of the population for the indicator

- Is the State using a subset of the population from the indicator (e.g., a sample, cohort model)? (yes/no)
- Provide a description of the subset of the population from the indicator.

Theory of Action

- Is the State's theory of action new or revised since the previous submission? (yes/no)
- Provide a description of the changes and updates to the theory of action.
 - SiMR change
 - Lack of progress
 - New state initiatives
- Provide a link to the current theory of action.

SSIP Modification

 Does the State intend to continue implementing the SSIP without modifications? (yes/no)

SSIP Modification (cont.)

 Does the State intend to continue implementing the SSIP without modifications? (yes/no)

If Yes:

 Describe how evaluation data support the decision to implement without any modifications to the SSIP.

Progress toward the SiMR

- Baseline year/data
 - Permitted to revise baseline year/data.
 - Required to provide an explanation for the revision.
 - OSEP expects states will revise baseline when:
 - There is a change in methodology or data source for the indicator that impacts comparability of the data.

Progress toward the SiMR cont.

- Targets and approach for measuring progress
 - Select YES if you are using two targets for measurement.
 - Option 1 using one target
 - Option 2 using two targets

Targets

- States need to provide measurable and rigorous targets (in percentages) for each of the six years FFY2020 through FFY 2025.
- The State's FFY 2025 target must demonstrate improvement over the State's FFY 2013 baseline data.
- Targets may be lower than those established 2016-19.
- A State may set a growth target for the SSIP but must discuss with their OSEP state lead.

FFY 2020 SPP/APR Data

- Description of the numerator
- Description of the denominator
- Statewide assessment from 2019 data is not available
- Provide the FFY 2020 target
- Calculated fields
 - FFY 2020 data
 - Status: met/not me

Slippage

- Provide reasons for slippage, if applicable
- If the SiMR is measured by the statewide assessment there won't be slippage because there are no 2019 data.
 - No data does not equal slippage.

Data Source for FFY 2020 data

- Provide the data source.
- Describe how data are collected and analyzed for the SiMR.

FFY2019 Optional: Additional Data



FFY2019 Data Quality: Concerns

Unrelated to COVID

- Student outcome data
- Data documenting the implementation of improvement activities
- Low response rate
- Data on fidelity of practices to model or EBP
- Data assessing training quality and knowledge/skills gained or changes to practices

Related to COVID

- Data Completeness
- Reliability
- Validity
- Timeliness
- Ability to collect data for the indicator

FFY2019 Data Quality: Actions Taken

Unrelated to COVID

- Facilitated ongoing stakeholder discussions
- Developed fidelity of intervention instruments
- Communicated with Special Education
 Directors to disseminate surveys to teachers
- Established communication pathways with participants to submit data more timely.
- Aligned with newly awarded SPDG
- Used value-added growth models to assess student growth

Related to COVID

- Shifted PL to virtual courses & book studies
- Developed remote administrative procedures for the universal screening tool
- Measured implementation using an EBP Implementation Fidelity Rubric
- Administered virtual data collection efforts
- Implemented supplemental online reading programs
- Convened staff across departments and divisions to discuss SSIP goals and plan for next steps.

Additional Points to Consider

- Describe any assessment flexibilities that were used under Indicator 3 and, if applicable, Indicator 17, if the State uses the Statewide assessment to measure its Stateidentified Measurable Result.
- While the template divides the "story" into sections, it is important that the story is coherent.


Evidence-Based Practices

Evidence-Based Practices: Impact

 - program/district policies, procedures, or practices
 - teacher/provider practices (e.g., behaviors)
 - parent/caregiver outcomes
 - child outcomes


Evidence-Based Practices: Data




State Trends: Concerns Expressed by Stakeholders




