

A Few Reminders on State Monitoring and Enforcement

From 34 C.F.R. § 300.600(b)

The primary focus on the State's monitoring activities must be on -

- Improving educational results and functional outcomes for all children with disabilities; and
- Ensuring that public agencies meet the program requirements under Part B of the Act, with particular emphasis on those requirements that are most closely related to improving educational results for children with disabilities.

A Few Reminders on State Monitoring and Enforcement – Con't

From 34 C.F.R. § 300.600(d):

The State must monitor the LEAs located in the State, using quantifiable indicators in each of the following priority areas, and using such qualitative indicators as are needed to adequately measure performance in those areas:

- Provision of FAPE in the least restrictive environment.
- State exercise of general supervision, including, child find, effective monitoring, the use of resolution meetings, mediation, and a system of transition services.
- Disproportionate representation of racial and ethnic groups in special education and related services, to the extent the representation is the result of inappropriate identification.

Example State Monitoring and Enforcement Activities

Interviewing LEA and local program staff

Conducting interviews and listening sessions

Analyzing local child find data across the state

Reviewing information collected through the state's data systems relating to local compliance

Examining and evaluating performance and results data on specific IDEA requirements

Analyzing assessment data to determine if the data represent improved results

Evaluating an LEA's policies, procedures, and practices for fiscal management

Examining information gleaned from the state's dispute resolution system
